NOTICE OF RACE & Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the Rules as defined by the 2013-2016 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). If any rules vary from the RRS, they will be to comply with the usual Sunday racing rules used by the Corinthian Sailing Club, White Rock Lake, Dallas, Texas.

2. BOAT AND CREW

2.1 The boat to be used will be the Corinthian.

2.2 Sail plan may include: A mainsail, jib, genoa and spinnaker.

2.3 Boats may carry as many crew as they like. No crew shall be added, subtracted or exchanged without prior notification and approval from the PRO.

3. FEES

Entry Fee shall be \$25.00 per skipper and \$15.00 per crew. This includes lunches for skipper and one crew..

4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Saturday October 5, 2019

0800 Registration and breakfast.

0900 Skippers' Meeting.

1000 Warning gun, First race of the day

1200 Lunch.

1300 Additional races to follow. No races shall start after 1700.

1730 Results and refreshments.

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The goal is to have ten (10) short races. The race committee plans to set up a windward/leeward course. The objective is to have many very short races to allow the competitors to practice their starting skills.

Any changes to these Sailing Instructions and will be delivered verbally or in writing at the skippers' meeting. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions shall be posted at the VIP Lounge. Three (3) races will constitute a regatta.

6. RACING AREA AND COURSE

Racing area will be White Rock Lake in Dallas, Texas.

Courses will be windward/leeward with a mid-course start and an offset at the windward mark.

7. SAFETY

7.1 Competitors shall have a U. S. Coast Guard (USCG) approved personal flotation device (PFD) for each crew member at all times while on the water.

7.2 A boat retiring from a race shall notify a Race Committee vessel before leaving the course, or when that is impossible, the PRO immediately after arrival ashore.

7.3 No whining or sniveling please. If you can't be happy, be somewhere else.

8. PRIZES

Oh, don't you worry your pretty little head about such things. Just get out there and do your best. Maybe something good will come of it.

9. ASSUMPTION OF RISK

By participating in this regatta, each boat owner, skipper and crew agrees to use the Corinthian Sailing Club and it's facilities at his or her own risk.
