NOTICE OF RACE & Sailing Instructions

1. RULES

1.1 This regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). If any rules vary from the RRS, they will be to comply with the usual Sunday racing rules used by the Corinthian Sailing Club, White Rock Lake, Dallas, Texas.

2. BOAT AND CREW

2.1 The boat to be used will be the Corinthian.

2.2 Sail plan may include: A mainsail, jib, genoa and spinnaker.

2.3 Boats may carry as many crew as they like. No crew shall be added, subtracted or exchanged without prior notification and approval from the PRO.

3. Registration & Fees:

3.1 Entry Fee shall be \$25.00 per boat. This includes breakfasts and lunches for skipper and one crew. Additional meals are available for \$10.00.

4. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS Saturday March 23rd, 2019

08:00-09:00 am Last minute Registration, pay the Treasurer your fee and breakfast (Coffee, fruit, yogurt, bagels etc.)

09:30 Skippers Meeting. Most likely at VIP.

10:00 -1030 Warning Signal, First race of the day, number of races prior to lunch at PRO's discretion.

12:30ish Lunch at VIP.

13:30ish Additional races to follow. No races shall start after 17:00.

17:30 Results and refreshments.

In the event of extremely bad weather, the regatta will be rescheduled. Date TBD.

5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The goal is to have ten (10) short races. The race committee plans to set up a windward/leeward course with probable mid-course starts. The objective is to have many very short races to allow the competitors to practice their starting skills. Highly Recommending attendance at the skippers meeting. Ask about starting line obstruction at the skippers meeting. Any changes to these Sailing Instructions and will be delivered verbally at (or in writing before) the skippers meeting. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions shall be posted at the VIP Lounge. Three (3) races will constitute a regatta.

6. RACING AREA AND COURSE

Racing area will be White Rock Lake in Dallas, Texas.

Courses will likely be windward/leeward with a mid-course start and an offset at the windward mark. Attend skippers meeting and confirm.

7. SAFETY

7.1 Competitors shall have a U. S. Coast Guard (USCG) approved personal flotation device (PFD) for each crew member at all times while on the water.

7.2 A boat retiring from a race shall notify a Race Committee vessel before leaving the course, or when that is impossible, the PRO immediately after arrival ashore.

7.3 No whining or sniveling please. If you can't be happy, be somewhere else.

8. PRIZES

Oh, don't you worry your pretty little head about such things. Just get out there and do your best. Maybe something good will come of it.
